FAIRFIELD – Writing a winning grant proposal can be as simple as knowing what funders want and the form in which they want it.

Almost half of all federal and foundation grant proposals are rejected because they are poorly organized or do not conform to guidelines. To switch the odds in your favor, Solano Community Foundation is hosting a free workshop entitled, “What Funders Want and How to Give it to Them,” geared to nonprofit directors and Board members who want to explore the way grantseekers think about development and understand how to incorporate this knowledge into their fundraising efforts.
